



Princeton Municipal Light Department (PMLD) customers who own select smart devices, such as Wi-Fi thermostats, are eligible to earn monthly rewards through the NextZero Connected Homes Program.

Connected Homes leverages the technology of smart appliances and devices into cost savings for PMLD and its customers. The program allows PMLD to better manage its electric load.

### How the Program Works

By enrolling a smart device in the Connected Homes Program, PMLD customers agree to allow Connected Homes to make brief, limited adjustments to their devices during times of peak electric demand, such as temporarily turning off an electric vehicle charger during peak hours.

PMLD customers will be informed of possible adjustments in advance via email and will be given the choice to opt out. Customers who decide to participate in adjustments will earn an incentive.

### Incentives

Connected Homes incentives are paid out quarterly via incentive checks. The incentive amount earned varies depending on the smart device.
